





"Hero" wrote on Chaski on 20 July 2017 (shortened): "I acquired this a number of years ago and put on a shelf. I think it's time to take it off the shelf and see what I can do with it. It's a spirit-fired 4-6-0 with a copper boiler that looks to have been riveted and caulked with soft solder. The axles are unsprung and there are no bushings or bearings that I can see. Someone seems to have just let the axles roll in drilled holes. There is evidence of considerable use everywhere, and the loco seems to have suffered a fire."

"By the time I received the loco, someone had lost many parts. There may even have been a tender at one time, I was told, though there certainly isn't one now. Oddly enough, despite all the carnage, when I applied a bit of air, the engine ran very smoothly in both directions. This makes me think that it might be salvageable with a new boiler and a lot of rebuilding." (Loco has since been stripped of all paint.)


